- A. I grant permission to the Center for Enhanced Academic Experiences to review academic and disciplinary records for the purpose of determining if my academic and student records meet the expectations for participating in a Lycoming College travel course.
- B. I understand that approval of enrollment in a travel course is contingent upon continued maintenance of appropriate academic performance and student conduct. I further understand that if I fail to maintain these standards of academic performance and conduct that I will be ineligible to participate in the travel component of the course and that any non-refundable deposits will be forfeited. For full-semester courses with travel that extends beyond the semester, students must maintain good academic standing and conduct within the class prior to the course travel component or students may be removed from the travel component of the course at the student's expense. - C. I understand that students participating in travel courses are global representatives of Lycoming College, and I will conduct myself in a manner appropriate to such representation and in accordance with the Lycoming College student code of conduct, even for seniors who graduate just prior to the travel component of the course.
- D. I grant Lycoming College permission to use my name, image, and term of study, in but not limited to publications, press releases, and website content.
- E. If I receive services through the Lycoming College Office of Disability Support Services, Health Services, or Counseling Services, I acknowledge that it is in my best interest to meet with a staff person in the appropriate office to develop a plan for a successful trip.
