“I AM BECOMING... A LYCOMING COLLEGE WARRIOR!”

Here are descriptions of the stations you will attend throughout Orientation today.

STATION ONE I am registering for classes.

- Your academic advisor will review your responses to the advising prep module, discuss your goals and aspirations, and help you finish selecting your fall semester classes. By the end of this session, you will have your first-ever college schedule in hand. Lycoming College, here I come!

STATION TWO I am having my voice heard.

- As a national liberal arts college, every year Lycoming College participates in various surveys. One particularly important survey is the CIRP Freshman Survey. This annual survey is part of a national study of college students conducted by the Higher Education Research Institute at UCLA. One major goal of this research is to determine what happens to students when they attend college. This study is designed to help improve the quality of the college experience. Results of your participation will also directly benefit Lycoming College, since we will receive complete tabulations of your responses to compare with the responses of students at other institutions. Your responses will be used only for research purposes and will be strictly confidential. Your participation is voluntary and will not affect your standing at Lycoming College. In addition, you will be taking Dr. Angela Duckworth’s 12-point Grit Scale, which will help us to understand how resilient and gritty our new Warriors are.

STATION THREE I am getting ready for work.

- To be successful in a job, you need to have the right equipment and the necessary tools. At Lycoming College, the tools you will need to be a successful Warrior include textbooks and other resources. The Streeter Campus Store team will show you the ropes not only for determining what books you will need, but also give you instructions for ordering them. The SOS will also lead a discussion about the differences between high school and college academics, and provide helpful tips about how to use the summer weeks to get your brain ready for your first day of classes.

STATION FOUR I am living and learning in campus housing.

- Approximately 90% of our Warriors live in campus housing. Residential Life Coordinators Justin Gambone and Will Dzuricko will talk with you about how to make the most of your residential experience. Not only will they show you a decorated room and talk to you about what you can (and cannot!) bring, they will also host a “floor program”—the very kind that you’ll have when you move in. In addition, they will also talk to those of you who commute about the importance of getting involved at Lycoming.

STATION FIVE I am getting involved in the life of my community.

- Whether it’s choir, varsity athletics, recreation and intramurals, fraternity and sorority life, or even Raging Stitches, the opportunities for new and exciting experiences are endless. Tara Leigh Sands and Kelly Henrie will not only talk with you about the opportunities, but together with the SOS they’ll give you the chance to have a little fun on the Quad.

STATION SIX I am launching into new opportunities.

- When you arrive in the fall, your life will truly take off. In addition to taking amazing classes and getting involved in the life of the community, you will have opportunities to explore campus employment and off-campus jobs, and even start thinking about internships and study abroad opportunities. The Center for Enhanced Academic Experiences team will help you get your “I am launching” accounts set up. You will use this important online tool over the next four years.
